

1 Minute Guide to Modern Slavery



Slavery can look different in the modern age.

This guidance is intended to help practitioners understand the issues of modern slavery and details the path a practitioner should take to risk assess and safeguard the adult.



Trafficking in people is a serious crime and is now referred to under the term "Modern Slavery." The Care Act 2014 includes modern slavery as a type of abuse. The commonly used definition of human trafficking is often referred to as the 'Palermo Protocol'.





Modern Slavery involves the exploitation of a person and legislation mentions holding the person in slavery or servitude or requiring the person to carry out forced or compulsory labour.



What do I do if I suspect modern slavery?

If the potential victim remains in the place of exploitation, is in danger or requires immediate assistance dial 999.
